NEW Family Registration for the 2017-18 Academic School Year

Registration for NEW families interested in enrolling in grades Pre-Kindergarten 3 and Kindergarten through 8th grades for the 2017-2018 academic school year is now open. To fill out an online application, please go to the school website: www.SaintCharlesSchoolSI.org and click on the "APPLY NOW" button.

After completing the application process, the school will contact you to set up a meeting and interview. At the time of the interview, please bring the child's birth certificate, baptismal certificate, immunization records, report cards and NYS ELA and Math scores (grades 3-8).

The application period for all Universal Pre-Kindergarten/Pre-K For All students will begin on **January 17, 2017** and end on Friday, **February 24, 2017**. All children born in 2013 who live in New York City are eligible to apply to PreK for All for the Fall 2017 school year.

The application can be done over the phone by calling 718-935-2067, in person at 715 Ocean Terrace, Building A, Staten Island, NY 10301 or on-line at schools.nyc.gov/ApplyOnline. No UPK applications can be submitted to St. Charles School. To be considered for the St. Charles UPK program, families will need to use the Saint Charles school code: 31RABM. If you have any UPK registration questions, please call Ms. Eileen at the school at 718-987-0200.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



MARRIAGE IS A VOCATION TOO...

The late Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen told a funny story of a time that he was travelling on a speaking engagement and had to stay in a very fancy hotel. When the bishop went out to give his talk, the maid unpacked his bags. One of the vestments that a bishop wears is called a Rochet. The Rochet is linen on top and then all lace from the waist down. When the bishop came home from giving his sermon, he found that the maid had placed his pajamas on one side of the bed and the lace Rochet on the other side obviously expecting a Mrs. Sheen!

Of course, as we know, bishops and priests do not get married. It is a commitment that is known as celibacy. Sometimes, the youngsters in religion class will question me about this commitment. They will say, "Father isn't it sort of like you're married to God?" And yes, I answer that's just the way it is. The priest assumes celibacy so that he can be free to serve God's people in a deeper, more committed way. It is a part of the priestly vocation and it is a sign of the kingdom.

When we talk about vocations, most often everybody refers to the priesthood or religious life. However, the concept of vocation is broader than that. The word "Vocation" really means "Calling." God calls some people to serve the Church in priesthood, diaconate, and religious life; others to the single life and many others to the married state. Yes, believe it or not, marriage is a vocation from God! Certainly it is an awesome commitment.

At a Catholic wedding ceremony, bride and groom take vows before God and the church that they will be faithful to each other in good times and in bad, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health until death do us part. Very significant words! Hopefully, each bride and groom take those words seriously; just as seriously as a new priest takes his vows seriously on ordination morning.

During the wedding homilies that I give here at St. Charles I always that I give here at St. Charles I always remind the young couples that "Love is blind but marriage is the eye opener." Is it difficult to live out the vocation of marriage? Certainly it is, but the Lord confers upon both husband and wife special graces in the sacrament to meet the challenges and difficulties that are part of any life.

The Church describes marriage as a union, a covenant that is "Sacred" and "Serious." It is sacred because it was established by Almighty God from the very beginning of time. It is serious too, because it binds a man and a woman together for life in a profoundly intimate bond of love—a love that is faithful, forever and life giving (babies!)

Today there is not only crisis in priestly vocations but there is also a decline in those embracing the married state. According to one statistic, only 51% of young people are currently approaching the sacrament. This is a statistic that I see verified often enough when some couples come in to have their children baptized. Often enough, they are not married in the Church at all for that matter!

So as Catholics, we have work to do. Please pray for more vocations—not only to the priesthood and the religious life but also to marriage. May God bless in a special way all those who are preparing to enter the marriage covenant. May they always be faithful!
